

Ground-Breaking Flat-Panel Design & G4 Processor Standard



"The new iMac ushers in the age of flat-screen computing for everyone. The CRT display is now officially dead," said Steve Jobs, Apple's CEO. "And with its powerful G4 processor and SuperDrive, everyone can now

own custom DVDs and CDs."

Photoshop Tip Stop Blushing!

Digital photos can look great\_except sometimes the faces can end up looking a little sunburned. Here's a quick photoshop fix--- adjust the hue and saturation until the face looks good and then take a Snapshot from the History palette. Tap on the originigal image in the History palette, set the brush icon next to the correct color Snapshot, and paint in a great looking face with pressure-sensitive control over opacity.

Another way to burn a bootable CD Using Apple's Disc Burner

Blake Hodgetts of Santa Monica wrote:

"Running OS X 10.1, insert a bootable CD--your Mac's Software Install CD, for example--and launch Disk Copy (Applications: Utilities).

Choose New Image From Device from the Image menu, and in the resulting dialog box, select vour CD-ROM drive. Click on

the Image button.

You'll be asked to specify a location for the image, as well as a format. Place the image wherever vou like and choose CD/DVD Master in the Format pop-up menu. Click on the Image button.

When Disk Copy finishes creating the image, choose Mount Image from Disk Copy's File menu. Once the image is mounted, you can modify it any way you like (by adding troubleshooting utilities, for exam-

When you've finished modifying your disk, remove the image by dragging it to the trash, and then select Burn Image from the Image menu. Select the image file you created and click on Burn to create your bootable

disc."



### Roxio<sup>™</sup> Toast Titanium 5 Simply Makes it Easy to Burn CDs in Every Popular Format

There are a handful of applications QuickTime applications such as that allow one to burn CDs on your Mac, but Toast Titanium 5 outshines all of them. Not only that, it export movie command in iMovie. works with OS 9 & 10!

Toast Titanium now sports a new graphical interface window that allows you to easily access the 3 most common ways that you use your CD burner. These are copying CDs, copying data, and audio CDs. You can access other formats through the "Other" pop-up format window.

You are now enabled to run other applications while burning CDs in the background. Toast allocates the necessary resources it needs to burn CDs successfully. I personally have tried this one time with phenomenal

You can now copy all, non-copy protected DVDs and single session CDs including audio CDs, CD ROMs, video CDs, and others CD-ROM XA and mixed mode CDs. Only the first session of a multi session CD will be copied. Toast $^{TM}$  also allows to add data to a session you already recorded and update your data with only the new files, leaving your previously recorded data intact. Only Apple drives and recorders controlled by the Toast CD reader our supported as source devices.

Toast now allows you to master DVD burning without using a separate application. It also supports DVD-R and DVD-RW recorders as well as DVD-RAM and DLT tape drives. Is the ideal companion to video authoring products including Apple's iDVD and DVD Studio Pro.

You can automatically prepare video files for video CD format and play them back cross platform. Titanium includes a QuickTime codec that encodes digital video into MPEG-1 and records it to video CD. This plug-in

QuickTime player and final cut pro. You can also access this through the

You can now automatically record MP3 formats and play them back on your CD-ROM audio players. You can access the proper format ( hybrid HFS/ISO 9660) by choosing the Other format drop-down menu.

Toast Titanium greatly simplifies the creation of cross-platform (hybrid) discs. You can now select which format(s) a data CD will be written in: Mac OS and PC, Mac OS extended only, or Mac OS Extended and PC.

Audio CDs now uses QuickTime to convert files and have no built-in support. Drag and drop any file that QuickTime understands into an audio window and Toast converts the file into standard audio format. (QuickTime can not convert audio from MPEG movies).

#### Making ABootable CD with Toast

Many of you have asked how to make a bootable CD. Toast offers vou two separate options. You can easily create a bootable using Toast Titanium, the data format, and selecting either at Mac OS CD or Mac OS and PC (hybrid) CD.

Using the Mac OS extended format to record your CD, you need to make a temporary partition from the utility's menu. Choose a size large enough to include a blessed system folder and give the partition in name then click OK. Find the icon of the temporary partition and click on it. In the Finder to choose erase disk from the special menu. In the erase dialog box, choose Mac 0S extended and click erase. Drag a blessed system folder and other data to temporary partition and record.

You are also able to use Mac Volume format. Using this method is available to you are allowed to record the entire

contents of a local volume or partition to the CD

in HFS or extended (HFS+) format. First you prepare your source volume exactly as it would appear on your CD. Next choose Mac Volume by choosing Other, holding down the mouse button and choosing Mac Volume. In New Mac volume dialog box select the volume you want. You can only select volumes that say "OK to write". By using the options in the dialog box, you are able to optimize on the fly, make a bootable disc or have your disc Autostart.



#### **System requirements:**

A Power Macintosh computer At least 12 MB of random access memory allocate allocated to the Toast application memory 24 MB recommended. More RAM allocated to Toast RAM cache can help alleviate data transfer irregularities.

For use with CD spin doctor, 128 megs built-in memory, virtual memory turned off, an aide to dig hard drive with least eight hundred MB allow able for digitizing audio.

This is by far the best CD burning program for the Mac on the market. There is absolutely no comparison to Apple's CD burner that comes free with systems 9 and 10. There are many other features that Toast Titanium 5 offers and it is a very good buy.


